This spring we marked 5 years since the new hospital opened. Since 2005, there has been ongoing work to complete the hospital upgrade, and we are very pleased we are able to maintain continuous improvement. This year the sewage system was upgraded, the site for the surgical bus was improved, the fire alarm system was tested and upgraded, and currently the roof over the old part of the hospital is being replaced.

Changes are a normal part of health service delivery and this year also saw the merger of the Southland and Otago District Health Boards, a combination of the primary health organisations in the area, and a campaign to retain neurosurgery in our region that was hugely organised and supported by the community.

The decade ahead of us will undoubtedly bring new challenges, and require innovations to address them. I wish to acknowledge the Friends of Dunstan Hospital who generously support us for small equipment needs on an ongoing basis and of course our community trust, Central Otago Health Inc. for their ongoing support. As always I acknowledge the dedicated staff at Dunstan Hospital who make all the difference to our patients.

Services Over December / January Holiday Season

Dunstan Hospital inpatient services will continue as usual throughout the holiday period. Admissions to hospital need to be made through General Practitioners or directly through St Johns Ambulance if an emergency occurs. The GP will assess the patient and discuss the need for possible hospitalisation with Dunstan Hospital doctors.

District nursing services will continue to be provided each day, except Christmas Day when an on call service is available. District Nurses will not go to Camping Grounds to see patients. These patients will need to arrange to see the District Nurse at Dunstan Hospital, or the District Nursing premises in Wanaka.

Occupational Therapy, Child Development Services, Medical Social Workers and Speech Language Therapy will not be available on weekends or Public Holidays.

The Outpatients Department will close on December 24th and reopen on January 17th.
